Kirsten Engel Reports Historic Fundraising Numbers for Third Quarter in a Row Engel raised nearly \$3 million in the third quarter of 2024

TUCSON, AZ — Today, **Democratic Candidate for Arizona's 6th Congressional District, Kirsten Engel** announced that she raised nearly \$3 million in Q3, setting a new record for the most raised by a campaign in the 6th District's history. This impressive haul brings her total for the cycle to over \$7.1 million, the most raised by a congressional challenger in Arizona history.

"Southern Arizonans are making it clear they want a change," **said Kirsten Engel**. "Ciscomani's actions speak louder than his words, and voters can see he is not the moderate he claims to be. From opposing the bipartisan border bill to his extreme positions on reproductive rights, voters know Ciscomani is more interested in playing politics than delivering solutions for Arizonans. I'm determined to build on this momentum and restore pragmatic leadership to Arizona's Sixth in November."

Background

The campaign has reserved over \$4 million in broadcast and digital communications between now and Election Day, and is running Spanish-language communications on broadcast, digital, and radio.

Engel faces Ciscomani in a rematch from 2022, where she lost by approximately 5,000 votes despite being outspent 6 to 1. She is committed to putting Arizona families over Washington special interests – that's why she has rejected corporate PAC money, and is proud to have received more than 78,000 individual donations this campaign cycle. Her average contribution is \$76. She has also secured key endorsements locally and nationally, including from Senator Mark Kelly, End Citizens United, Planned Parenthood, and AFSCME.

Kirsten Engel is a mom, an environmental attorney, and a former State Legislator who has fought for years to restore funding to public schools, protect Arizona's natural resources, and make our communities safer. She's ready to take that fight to Washington to find common-sense solutions to the challenges we're facing here in Arizona's Sixth Congressional District.
